“SHOOTING FOR THE FUTURE”

NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP SHOOT-OFF FORMAT

To showcase the day's top shooters and to increase excitement for spectators, a National Scholarship Shoot-Off will be conducted at the conclusion of the flight shooting and before the awards presentation. The top 4 scoring boys and top 4 scoring girls (combined division) will be invited to participate. In the event of a tie in the top 4 qualifying scores within either gender, the “x” ring will be in play to determine the top 4 qualifying shooters. In the event the score and the number of “x’s” are identical for any shooters in determining the top 4, those tied shooters will shoot one arrow each. The arrow closest to the center of the “x” will be the victor and move on to the scholarship shoot-off.

The format for this scholarship shoot-off will be as follows:

- Each student will shoot 1 end of 5 arrows at 15 meters for practice/warm-up.
- Each student will shoot 1 end of 5 arrows at 15 meters for score.
- The highest scoring 3 boys and 3 girls will move to the next round.
- These 6 shooters will shoot 1 end of 5 arrows at 15 meters.
- The highest scoring 2 boys and 2 girls will move to the final round.
- These 4 shooters will shoot 1 end of 5 arrows at 15 meters.
- The highest scoring boy and girl will be declared winners of the scholarship shoot-off.
- The “x” ring will be in play throughout these rounds with the number of “x’s” used to break ties.
- In the event the score and the number of “x’s” are identical for any shooters in any round, those shooters will shoot one arrow each. The arrow closest to the center of the “x” will be the victor.

Each of the 8 shooters will be eligible to receive a scholarship for use pursuing post-secondary education on a full-time basis. In addition to meeting the objective scoring criteria described above, awards will be given under the following conditions:

1. If a participant does not pursue post-secondary education on a full-time basis, he or she will forfeit the award.
2. The participant may attend the institution of his or her choice. However, as a condition of receiving the award, the institution must be state licensed and accredited by the applicable national accrediting agencies for two or four year schools.
3. If the award is not used by the participant within five years of completing high school, the award will be forfeited
4. A scholarship may be awarded to the same participant on an annual basis (i.e., a participant is eligible to win a scholarship for each year he or she participates in the Tournament).
5. Awards will be paid directly to the recipient's school, to be used towards tuition, room, board, and other fees charged by the institution.

6. Participants will not be paid interest on their awards, regardless of the length of time between the awarding of the scholarship and its payment.

The NASP reserves the right to amend these rules or promulgate such additional rules as it deems necessary to administer and carry out the purposes of the "Shooting for the Future" program.
