NASP

The National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) is designed to teach archery to students in grades 4 through 12 Physical Education classes. Students have the opportunity to shoot at bulls-eye targets placed before an arrow-resistant net in their gymnasium. Teachers can run this course any time of the year, regardless of weather. It can also be adapted to outdoor ranges.

Students use state-of-the-art equipment designed to fit individual needs, no matter what their strength. The core content of the program, written by professional curriculum writers, covers safety, technique, equipment maintenance, mental concentration, and self-improvement.

NASP allows all students--regardless of athletic ability or gender--to participate in this sport together. NASP often inspires after-school activities shared by families and friends. The program teaches discipline, respect and self-control. NASP has energized kids & teachers in many ways. Parents, teachers and students want archery. They love archery. And NASP has proven this without a shadow of a doubt.



HISTORY of NASP:

NASP began in Kentucky in March 2002. Today, 48 states and several countries are involved in NASP. Wisconsin DNR brought the program to our state in February 2005. To date about 1000 teachers and other archery educators have been certified in Wisconsin NASP. Equipment:

A typical classroom set of NASP equipment includes:

- 12 Genesis youth compound bows
(2 are left-handed)
- 5 bulls-eye targets
- 5 dozen aluminum shaft arrows
- 1 30' arrow-resistant safety net
- 1 or 2 bowrack, 1 toolkit

The average cost of a classroom set is about \$3000. Most schools get donations from local wildlife conservation groups, rod & gun clubs, archery clubs, civic organizations and businesses.
